Pragmatica Holding Ltd increases share capital and changes its name

Strategic expansion into alternative renewable energy

Spreitenbach, April 30, 2007. Pragmatica Holding Ltd delivered a positive result for the 2006 business year with a turnover of CHF 3.53 million. Agenda items at the annual general meeting set for May 30, 2007, will comprise an increase in share capital and a name change to “Global Natural Resources Holding Ltd”. The Board of Directors will also undergo a complete change.

In terms of operating income, Pragmatica's 2006 turnover totals CHF 3.53 million (previous year, CHF 4.60 million), principally due to personnel absences caused by illness and to re-scheduling projects to the current year – which left the positive nature of all key figures unaffected.

At CHF 0.02 million, the EBITDA shows a considerable reduction from the previous year's CHF 0.34 million. While the CHF 0.004 million EBIT, which covers continuing operations, also remains in the black, it has declined from the CHF 0.30 million posted in 2005. The CHF 0.01 million in after-tax earnings also remains positive (2005: CHF 0.1 million reflecting losses from discontinued operations). At CHF 3.56 million, liquid funds are down CHF 0.21 million. The CHF 0.00 per-share earnings figure (previous year, CHF 0.02), is irrelevant in practical terms. There will not be a dividend.

May 30, 2007 annual general meeting heralds major change of direction

At the May 30 annual general meeting shareholders will be asked to change the name of the company from Pragmatica Holding Ltd to Global Natural Resources Holding Ltd (GNR). The reason is that, next to its regular IT business, a strategic expansion will take the company into developing agricultural projects in alternative energy and other renewable resources, too. Another agenda item calls for an increase in share capital, of CHF 3 million, by means of fully paid-up bearer shares and an increase of authorized and of conditional share capital in two

stages. The new major shareholder Swiss British Fiduciary Trust Center Ltd (SBFTC), which in February 2007 acquired 49.23 percent of Pragmatica's shares, has declared to fully exercise its pre-emptive rights regarding the new share issue. This capital increase will enable speedy implementation of the new growth strategy.

By means of a share-swap, SBFTC will place ten percent of its shares in Germany's FloraEcoPower Holding Ltd (FEP) into the renamed company. FEP produces biodiesel fuel from the high-yield jatropha and castor bean plants. As these plants are not suitable for human consumption, producing biodiesel from their seeds and beans has no direct impact on the human food chain and thus, on food prices. Jatropha and castor bean plantations thrive in arid to subtropical-Mediterranean regions, that is, mainly in the Third World. Their labor-intensive cultivation creates new jobs for rural populations. These factors combine to create a promising starting point for meeting growing demand for biodiesel raw material. Joint ventures and acquisitions are to push forward vertical integration, from cultivation to biodiesel production and refining.

New Board members nominated

At the upcoming annual general meeting, present Chairman Dr. Clino Vallone and members Mr. Gerardo Cristiano and Dr. Gerfried Mülleitner will tender their resignations from the Board. New nominees are member of the Swiss Federal Parliament, Council of States, lic. iur. Bruno Frick as designated Chairman and as members, former German State Minister and EU Ambassador to Moscow Dr. Ottokar Hahn, Thomas Hirsiger, MBA, CEO Allied Finance, former Prime Minister of Liechtenstein lic. iur. Markus Büchel, and Dr. Hardy P. Weiss, ETH Graduate Engineer.

Renewable resources – an attractive growth market

Chairman nominee Frick comments his commitment as follows: "Public debate on climate change and its impact on energy policy call for large-scale production of renewable energy. We intend to position GNR Holding as an important player, including in the production of biodiesel made from plants outside the food chain. The opportunities for shareholders, present and future, are considerable."
